Dear Parents and Community Members,

The report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education provides a picture of the academics and growth at Four Rivers Community School. During the 2015-2016 school year, Oregon replaced the OAKS test with the new Smarter Balanced test. The new tests are more complex with critical thinking skills, problem solving, writing, and are aligned to the new Common Core State Standards. For this reason, individual student scores as well as school and district scores are lower as schools adjust their curriculum. We have seen improvement over last year's scores and expect results to continue improving over time. *We are pleased with our students'*

Schools will not receive an overall "rating" from the State of Oregon this year during this transition. **Though not reflected in this report card, Four Rivers Community School test data reflected impressive growth for students all students in math and language arts. In the area of growth, FRCS received a Level 4 rating on a 1-5 scale.** We are proud of the achievements that students are making in two languages and appreciate your continued support. Please help your child experience academic success by attending school every day, attending parent workshops, and communicating with your child's teacher. Thank you for your support!

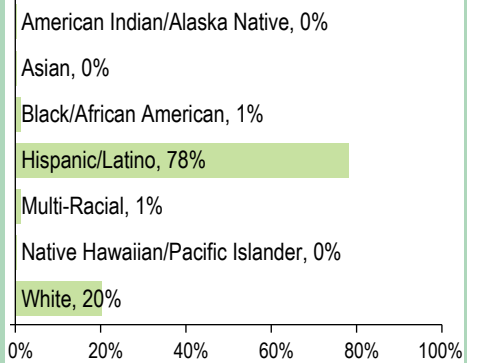

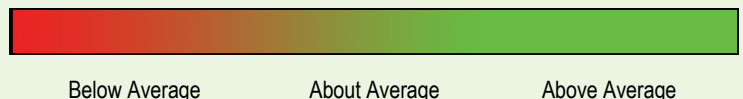
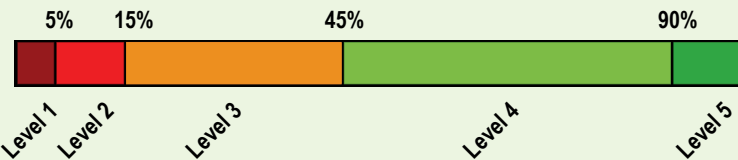
